

BIO OF JOHN S. KENDALL, ESQ.

Born on Chicago's Westside and currently residing in Oak Park, he attended The Ohio State University School of Law, J.D. 1990 and University of Dayton, BEE 1885. He was admitted to practice in the State of Ohio (1990), the State of Illinois (1991); U.S. District for the Southern District of Ohio (1991); U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Illinois (1992); U.S. Patent & Trademark Office (1993), and National Institute of Trial Advocacy (NITA 1994).

He clerked for nationally renowned Sughrue, Mion, Zinn, McPeak & Seas, where he drafted amendments to existing patent applications in the electrical, mechanical and aerospace arts as well as provided trademark litigation support. He authored "Federal Protection Against Unfair Competition" Patent, Trademark, Copyright Report, Vol. 4 (Fall 1990), and Intellectual Property: Don't Lose Your Most Valuable Asset" Black MBA Magazine (September 1999).

Before going to law school, he worked as a communications systems engineer for Northrop Defense Systems Division and was responsible for testing the electronic countermeasures system placed on U.S. Air Force F-15 and F-16 Aircraft Fighters.

He has been a member of 100 Black Men of Chicago since its inception as its founding vice president, board member and is a chapter past president. Nationally, he has served as a board member for 10 years, is serving his fourth term on the executive committee and was recently elected as its Vice Chair of Development.

Most recently he elected as chairman of the Metropolitan Reclamation District of Greater Chicago Civil Service Board, which is composed of three attorneys that are empanelled to serve as administrative judges.

His most recent awards and honors include Allstate Insurance Company "*From Whence We Came*" (2007) for community service; Connection Enterprise, Inc. "Men of Excellence Award" (2005); and Cook County Bar Association's "J. Earnest Wilkins Award" (2004).
